## For every vessel call, it is <u>mandatory</u> to submit the following information:

- Visit-ID (CYLMS....)
- Vessel Name
- Vessel IMO-Number
- Vessel Service and which other Shipping Lines will discharge / load cargo on this vessel
- Voyage Number (Carrier specific)
- > Planned ETA (Estimated Time of Arrival)
- Planned ETD (Estimated Time of Departure)
- > Planned Number of moves (exact number not required)

#### **Vessel Specification**



#### It is imperative that the following information is submitted to Eurogate CTL once for every vessel, before the first call:

- Vessel IMO-Number
- Vessel LOA (length over-all)
- Vessel width (beam)
- > Max. draft
- > Board equipment (like cranes, athwart stowage)
- Bayplan (cell structure)
- > Stackweights
- > Clearances under deck
- > Hatch cover details
- > Reefer plugs

#### **Container Data Information from CTL to Agents**



# Every Agent, whether the port call is under their Agency or not, can retrieve information from Eurogate CTL in the following ways:

- Manually via PCS, exactly as in the past.
- > Automatically via EDIFACT (COARRI) for waterside operation direct from CTL
- Automatically via EDIFACT (CODECO) for landside operation direct from CTL
- Manually via Infogate report on request direct from CTL
- > Automatically via Infogate Notification Service by mail direct from CTL
  - Gate In Report for the last day
  - Gate Out Report for the last day
  - Vessel Discharge Report after discharge operation is completed
  - Vessel Load Report after load operation is completed
  - Daily stock report
